Pastor Mignelis Figueroa Lazcano is a native from Puerto Rico, USA Territory. She is the oldest daughter of pastor parents (Rev. Nelson Figueroa and Local pastor Migdalia Acevedo.) She was baptized and a former member of The United Evangelical Church of Puerto Rico. Mignelis moved to Kentucky in December 2002, following her father's call for ministry as Church planter for the Kentucky Annual Conference of UMC. Mignelis was married in September 2009, to Miguel Lazcano with whom she has two beautiful children, Mireily Joyce and Miguel Jeremiah.

After 6 years of membership in the United Methodist Church, and serving as a founding member of the Hispanic local church Emmanuel es el camino in Northen Kentucky, Mignelis felt called to move in 2009 to serve and help grow the young church Fuente de Avivamiento in Lexington, Ky. Mignelis developed strong leadership skills as lay leader for a period of about 5 years. Within those years Mignelis received a call for ministry focusing on pastoring, became licensed to preach in 2014 and served as local pastor under the mentoring of Rev. Dr. losmar Alvarez.
